



U.S. HARDWOOD LUMBER CONSUMPTION





 - Post 2009 to today






VALUE OF HARDWOOD LOG EXPORTS FOR SELECT SPECIES GROUPS 2000




VALUE OF HARDWOOD LOG EXPORTS FOR SELECT SPECIES GROUPS 2000 AND 2009




VALUE OF HARDWOOD LOG EXPORTS FOR SELECT SPECIES GROUPS 2000, 2009, 2018 AND 2019




VOLUME OF HARDWOOD LOG EXPORTS FOR SELECT SPECIES GROUPS




VALUE OF HARDWOOD LOG EXPORTS BY MAJOR DESTINATION 2000, 2007, AND 2009










