SBIO 3984 Ireland: Culture, History, and Environment

County Galway, County Donegal and Northern Ireland Spring 2020 (March 6 - 15)

DESCRIPTION

This course explores how environment and history have shaped Irish culture, and helped define what it means to be Irish (and Irish/American). We will learn about the history of Ireland from ancient times to the possible impact of Brexit. Students will experience the Irish environment as well as Irish language and music. Learning will be through visiting and directly experiencing locations that are historically, culturally, and environmentally meaningful. Each day of the program will include hiking and/or other outdoor activities.
